


Stark Tuscarawas Workforce Development Board Welcomes New Board Members

New Grant Funding Available for Potential Adult Buckeye Career Center Students

A new state funding opportunity is allowing area adults the opportunity to further their training for a fraction of the cost. The Talent Ready Grant Program provides direct financial grants to adults who apply to attend classes that meet the needs of regional businesses and industries.

Buckeye Career Center (BCC) Adult Education courses that qualify for use of the funding include full-time options of Welding Technology, Law Enforcement Training Academy, Esthetics, HVAC-R, Dental Assisting, Medical Office Support, Heavy Equipment CDL A, and Utility Lineworker.

Part-time options include EMT – Basic, EMT – Advanced, Firefighter Level 1, Firefighter Level 2, Firefighter Level 1 & 2 Combination, Industrial Electricity I, Industrial Electricity II, Industrial Electricity III, Nail Technician, Auto Tech (Brakes), Auto Tech (Basic Repair), Auto Tech (Electrical), Auto Tech (Steering/Suspension), State Tested Nursing Assistant (STNA), Phlebotomy, CNC Machining, Welding Short Course, Manufacturing Warehouse Associate, FAA 107 Drone Pilot, and Public Safety Communicator.

This grant is designed to support students who plan to take a class of less than 30 credit hours or 900 seat hours that can be completed in less than one year. The funding is up to \$3,000 for a credential class. Limited funds are available until exhausted. This grant is not based on the financial need of the application. To be considered for the grant, interested students must be an Ohio resident, registered with Selective Service if male age 18-26 years, and be enrolled in one of the programs listed above.


